## Grand Representative Trip to Sao Paulo, Brazil

On March 17, I boarded a plane to attend the Grand Session of Brazil in Sao Paulo. I was met at the airport by my counterpart Sister Heidi Maithias and spent the next several days with her and her family visiting Sao Paulo.

After several days of touring, we went to a Mineral & Gemstone Store and then had tea at the House of Italy forty-two stories above the city, the views were breath-taking. After tea, there was a samba rehearsal & I thought I was just going to watch but the next thing I know I'm joining them. I attended Heidi's chapter meeting. It was fascinating hearing the ritual in Portuguese. The women sit on the Worthy Matron's right and the men sit to Worthy Patron's left. In attendance that night were Grand Representatives of Sao Paulo in Scotland, Bolivia and Maryland. We each spoke about our Chapters, how long we have been in the Eastern Star, our experiences in our Grand Chapters, and how we support the Masonic Youth in our State.

On Thursday we were given a tour of the Grand Lodge of Sao Paulo and visited the Grand Master. It was a very formal introduction and a very moving experience. After the introductions he provided each visitor with a special thank you gift. That evening we attended the Informal Welcome Dinner. The entertainment that evening was a Brazilian Country, Rock and Rock-a-Billy artist and everyone had a good time.

Friday Morning I attended the Grand Representatives Meeting, The Worthy Grand Matron thanked all the visiting Grand Reps for attending and was please to report that she increased the number of Grand Representatives in Sao Paulo to 89 appointments. In the afternoon was the ritualistic opening of Grand Chapter and various reports. Some interesting facts - Sao Paulo has 37 chapters with 1,047 members and this was the 4<sup>th</sup> Session. Friday evening was the Formal Opening and I was officially welcomed; Heidi and I walked in together while she carried the Maryland State Flag.



The biggest honor I had was carrying the American Flag. As I'm standing there waiting for the American National Anthem to begin, tears begin to flow because I AM proud to be an American. After this meeting we went to the formal dinner.

Saturday morning I did some shopping and relaxed by the pool. At the afternoon meeting, there were 2 ceremonies, one between the Sao Paulo and Bolivia Grand Chapters explaining their friendship and co-operation together as Sisters and Brothers in the Eastern Star. Then eighteen Job's Daughters from Agnes Bethel No. 11 presented a ceremony explaining what Job's Daughters is and why the Star should support them. This was truly amazing for me as a Past Honored Queen and I met with them afterwards and took lots of pictures. They gave me a special cheer saying they were happy to meet me and we are all sisters through Job's Daughters. During the evening's traditional Brazilian Barbeque there were presentations to the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron including the Samba performance that was rehearsed on Tuesday. It was a lot of fun and everyone was really surprised that I was up there with the other dancers. I had a BLAST. After the presentations we again danced the night away.

Sunday was the Open Installation. It was beautiful and there were speeches and well wishing from the Distinguished Guests and Sister Paula Swansey, Virginia's Associate Grand Conductress gave the greeting for the American Star Members. I had



the pleasure to meet the first Worthy Grand Matron of Sao Paulo, who appointed Brother Pat Curtis as Grand Representative during her year and I met the Worthy Grand Matron who signed my commission to represent Sao Paulo. The events ended too quickly and I had a hard time saying farewell to all the fast friends I met while in Sao Paulo. I want to tell who ever is the next Grand Representative of Sao Paulo in Brazil, reach out and get in touch with your counterpart. You may get lucky and she or he will understand English, if not don't let that discourage you. If you have access to the Internet, Google has a program that can translate your letters into Portuguese. It's not perfect but it does get the point across. The Brazilians are a gracious people, who love to have a good time and they have showed me so much love I will be going back for another sessions one day.

Sister Leslie, "Miss Daisy", I want to thank you for giving me this opportunity; It is one that I will always remember.
